The Oregon Coast Council for the Arts proudly celebrated its 36th year with our brand promise to promote and provide high-caliber arts experiences on the Oregon coast.

Our hundreds of dedicated volunteers, generous business supporters (both with cash and in-kind), passionate-about-the-arts arts partners, forward-looking sponsors and donors, and committed OCCA board help us realize our accomplishments as we serve this community, this county and the Oregon coast.

Lavern understood the long-range importance of "Entertain the Future," the Performing Arts Center Capital Campaign,



and offered excellent insights because of his experience at the Hatfield Marine Science Center. He and his wife, Pat Lewis, were regular attendees of many OCCA events at the PAC. "It was only here at the PAC with the Met Opera Live in HD, that I have become an opera fan and I plan to attend as often as possible in the future." After his introduction to opera he couldn't stay away and even hosted some of our Met operas.

Lavern's leadership on our board will be missed. He was one of our Community Legends and rightfully so.

### PAC CAPITAL CAMPAIGN 2013-14 UPDATE

OCCA's "Entertain the Future!" Capital Campaign to Expand and Enhance the Newport Performing Arts Center has had a successful year with the completion of Phase II Acoustical Upgrade in our ambitious five-year project.

With the installation of the cutting-edge Meyer Constellation Acoustic Enhancement System in the Alice Silverman Theatre, the Newport Performing Arts Center is now the only venue between San Francisco and Vancouver, B.C. to feature this advanced and innovative acoustic system. 'Constellation' debuted to critical acclaim at the Newport Symphony Orchestra's final two concerts of the year at the end of March 2014. A reception honoring the donors, including the Newport Symphony Orchestra, volunteers, and businesses that helped us complete the second initiative, followed the concerts.

OCCA received grants towards the Acoustic Enhancement Upgrade from the Autzen Foundation, the Collins Foundation,

the Henry Lea Hillman, Jr. Foundation, Oregon Cultural Trust, and the Siletz Tribal Charitable Contribution Fund.

OCCA would like to thank all of the donors who have contributed to Phase II as well as the performers, volunteers and PAC RATS who gave of their time to fundraising events including OMTA Spotlight on the PAC; Kaffee und Kuchen with Erica Brookhyser; a concert by Seann Branchfield and Crystal Kim; and the Playwrights and Composers Symposium.

OCCA acknowledges the work of the OCCA Board and Mark McConnell, Capital Campaign Committee Chair, as well as Frank Geltner and Akia Woods.

A lobby display featuring the 8 Phases of the Capital Campaign, Donor List and Fundraising Progress has been installed and we encourage you to come by and see what it is all about.

The planning stages of Phase III Signage and Phase IV Lighting are in the works with a targeted completion date of December 31, 2014.

OCTOBER 2013 – OCCA celebrates 10 years of Oregon Coast Jazz Party and launches the new Met Opera Live in HD season.

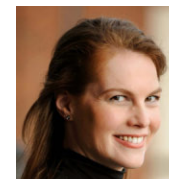


JANUARY 2014 – OCCA facilitates community-wide Visual Arts Center visioning sessions.

APRIL 2014 – OCCA hosted the 19th Newport Paper Arts Festival. OCCA continues hosting NT Live and presents "War Horse."

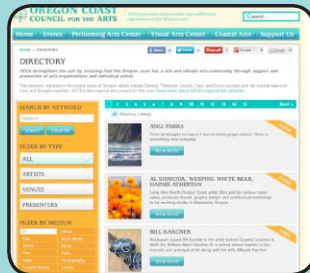




## OCCA SERVES AS A HUB OF ARTS OPPORTUNITIES

We are the “go-to” source for arts information on the Oregon Coast.

**Coastarts.org Events and Coastal Directory of Artists, Venues and Presenters** is the only one of its kind focusing on arts on the Oregon coast. Arts partners enter hundreds of events and directory listings.



In partnership with Yaquina Bay Communications, OCCA presented 52 weekly live “Arts Talk” radio shows, featuring over 617 news items and 60 interviews on arts, heritage and humanities topics to Lincoln County, broadcast on KNPT, KBCH, KWDP, podcasts, and KNPTAM.com. Now in its 14th year, “Arts Talk” now reaches over 50,000 listeners per broadcast.

**Now Playing** ads in the News-Times and Oregon Coast Today highlighted eight different towns and areas in Lincoln County and listed hundreds of events for locals and visitors to attend. QR codes direct people to the website.

## OCCA HOSTS WORLD-CLASS ARTS EXPERIENCES

We bring to our local community high-caliber arts experiences – taking advantage of our local treasures, and providing access to world-renowned artists.

The 10th annual Oregon Coast Jazz Party featured **28** international, national and regional musicians, performing in seven sets comprising **16 sessions** in the “jazz party” format over 3 days.

Met Opera Live in HD was broadcast around the world, offering **10 diverse operas** featuring hundreds of singers. The PAC is one of only eight venues in Oregon to feature The Met Live. The series brought an average of **98 attendees per performance**.

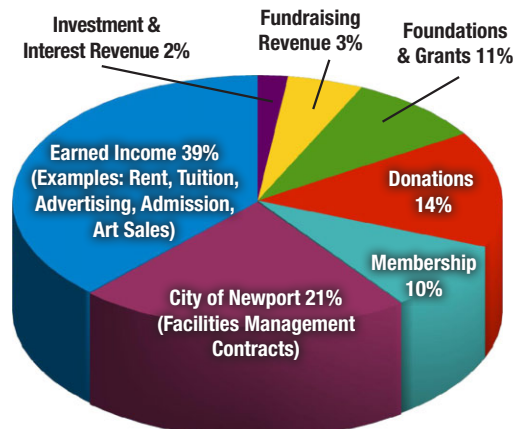

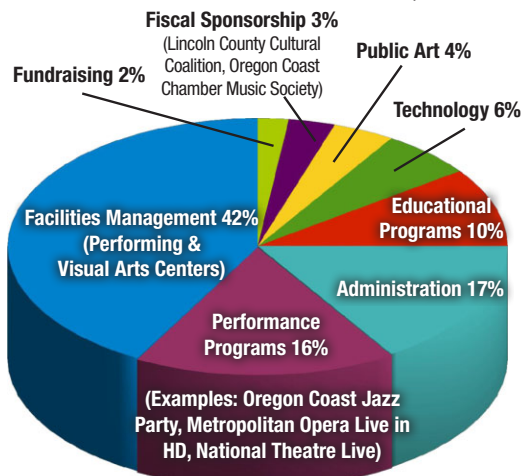
