this annual report, OCCA celebrates its members, volunteers, donors, nonprofit partners, and supporters who all contribute to make the work and mission of the Oregon Coast Council for the Arts a reality in this community, in this county, and along the 363 miles of the Oregon coast.

This past year, the Newport Performing Arts Center "Entertain the Future" capital campaign focused on Phases 5 (Women's Restroom) and 6 (PAC Lobby Expansion); the Newport Visual Arts Center (VAC) Steering Committee provided a

second-year report to the City of Newport city council, which was approved.

With a Trust Management grant we created a PAC Sound Apprenticeship program to train youth and adults on our new digital soundboard that increases capacity and services to PAC performers.

Art Fridays, guided by a new Youth Arts Advisory group, was born last fall at the VAC and serves dozens of youth with exciting visual arts learning.

With a Meyer Memorial Trust grant, we created an online course – "Show Your Art/Share Your Culture" – for our arts partners so they can input their information on our coastarts.org website events and directory pages, thus increasing their marketing and organizational capacity.

Our mission would not soar without a dedicated OCCA staff and board that keep our operations and programs moving with commitment, excellent customer service and creativity. VAC Associate Manager Emily Saunders joined our staff, and we all said a fond retirement farewell to Polly Ivers, our business manager and bookkeeper of 28 years. Mark Farley joined the board, and Mark McConnell says goodbye as he and Cindy move to Sunriver.

We say goodbye to Alice Silverman, whose dedicated fundraising and commitment to the arts were such gifts to the community, and to former OCCA VAC Director and youth arts advocate Nancy Jane Reid.

We look back on the year with pride in our work together and count on your involvement and support as we continue our mission "to develop, promote and celebrate community arts."

The Oregon Coast Council for the Arts Board of Directors is a very hard working and active board! You might ask what does it mean to be an "active board"? Let me answer that by providing a brief overview of some of the on-going work that is done by our board members.

Each OCCA Board member serves on several committees. For example, board members actively participate on the Community Legends Committee, VAC Steering Committee, strategic planning, Personnel Committee, new hire interview team, PAC Capital Campaign, grant writing, PAC Usage Policy, Oregon Coast Jazz Party, fundraising & membership.

Board members attend monthly meetings to review the OCCA budget, discuss and plan fundraising events, and assist in decision-making regarding many aspects of OCCA. They also attend non-profit trainings, Newport City Council meetings and exhibits at the VAC, provide graphic design and illustration assistance, coordinate and facilitate event planning, encourage participation in events and community involvement, teach art and grow education opportunities at the VAC, spread the word about opportunities for people to be involved in events, as well as participate in radio promotion of events.

Not all board members sing, paint, dance, or act, but they volunteer to support and enjoy those artists and the art they create. As an OCCA board member, significant time is devoted to fundraising, organizing events and activities, providing oversight to operation of the PAC and VAC, and supporting regional arts programs.

They serve as ambassadors of the OCCA. The OCCA Board of Directors is most definitely a hard working active board sustaining and expanding arts and cultural opportunities in Lincoln County and all along the Oregon Coast.

Your dedicated board members are listed on the back of this Annual Report.

On behalf of the board, we thank you for being an OCCA member, and if you are not, I encourage you to join us in our important work as a local and regional arts council. Your membership is vitally important for OCCA to continue its promise to "promote and provide high-caliber arts experience on the Oregon Coast."

OCCA SERVES AS A HUB OF ARTS OPPORTUNITIES

We are the **"go-to" source for arts information** on the Oregon Coast.

Coastarts.org's Events and Coastal Directory of Artists, Venues and Presenters is the only one of its kind focusing on arts on the Oregon coast. Arts partners enter hundreds of events and directory listings.

Over 3,000 visitors – from all over the world, but mostly from the Portland and Willamette Valley areas – visit the website monthly (during the last year) with **more than 160,000 pageviews**.

In partnership with Yaquina Bay Communications, OCCA presented 52 weekly live radio "Arts Talk" shows, featuring over 708 news items and 72 interviews with 114 guests on arts, heritage and humanities topics to Lincoln county broadcast on KNPT, KBCH, KWDP, podcasts, and KNPTAM. com. Now in its 15th year, "Arts Talk" reaches over 50,000 listeners per broadcast.

Now Playing ads in the News-Times and Oregon Coast Today highlighted eight different towns and areas in Lincoln County and listed **over 864 events** for locals and visitors to attend. **QR codes** direct people to coastarts.org.

OCCA HOSTS WORLD-CLASS ARTS EXPERIENCES

We bring to our local community high-caliber arts experiences – taking advantage of our local treasures, and providing access to world-renowned artists.

The 12th annual **Oregon Coast Jazz Party** featured 23 international, national and regional musicians, plus 7 Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz Ensemble musicians performing in 9 sets comprising 19 sessions in the "jazz party" format over 3 days. Oregon Coast Jazz Party activities benefited the area in FY '15 by **\$214,542** in

cultural tourism, with **2,264 attendees**. **Met Opera Live in HD**'s 2015-16

season offered 10 diverse operas spanning five centuries and featuring hundreds of singers.

The PAC is one of only eight venues in Oregon to feature The Met Live. The Met Opera Live in HD brought an average of 98 attendees per performance.





National Theatre London Live in HD broadcasted around the world with 9 performances. The PAC is one of only five venues in Oregon to feature NT Live.




OCCA PRESENTS EXCEPTIONAL VARIETY

We provide access to an immense range of artistic experiences, so there is really "something for everyone." The Coastal Oregon Visual Artists

Showcase (COVAS) featured mid-career Oregon coastal artists from Curry, Tillamook, coastal Lane, Coos, coastal Douglas, and Clatsop counties.

We featured 21 exhibits in three galleries at the VAC, with over 17,974 attendance. Based on guest book signing visitors represented 48 states, 30 countries, and over 144 Oregon towns.





OCCA NURTURES THE ARTIST IN EVERYONE

OCCA provides a range of educational opportunities for artists – professionals and amateurs alike - so that they can cultivate their creative spirits.

The 2015 **Newport Paper & Book Arts Festival** is one of the preeminent festivals in the Northwest with 109 enrollees from 4 states.



STATE OF THE PROJECT

PHASE 5 ~ WOMEN'S RESTROOM EXPANSION

The Women's Restroom will be remodeled and reconfigured so that the ADA stall will be enlarged and three new stalls will be added. Both restrooms will be refreshed with new paint, fixtures and improved air flow.

PHASE 6 ~ LOBBY EXPANSION

The PAC Lobby will be expanded with a 612 square foot addition to the north. This will provide a more adequate audience space during intermission as well as accommodating community meetings and rehearsals. This new space will include enhanced seating, sound, lighting and multi-media systems.

The local architectural firm of Goebel and Capri were retained to facilitate the design and create construction documents for the Women's Restroom and PAC Lobby. A volunteer design and review committee consisted performing artists, community members and OCCA staff. The City of Newport bid package was published July 18, with the bid opening happening in late August.

OCCA received a grant towards the Restroom and Lobby expansion from the Ford Family Foundation.

"OCCA would like to thank all the donors, to date, who contributed to the 'Women's Relief Fund' and 'Lobbyist for the Arts' fundraising initiatives, as well as the PAC RATS, volunteers and the City of Newport for all their hard work in getting Phases 5 and 6 off the ground," says OCCA Executive Director Catherine Rickbone.

"ENTERTAIN THE FUTURE!" FUNDRAISING

OCCA's fall 2015 fundraising letter was very successful bringing in more than \$31,000 and five fundraising concerts netted \$4,500 and brought in 169 new patrons to the PAC. These concerts were George Winston, Celtic Christmas, Country on the Coast, Halie Loren and Friends, and Pendleton Men's Chorus.

VISUAL ARTS CENTER UPDATE

The 2015-16 fiscal year at the Newport Visual Arts Center began, quite literally, like a wave. The "Surf & Turf: the Art of Boarding" exhibition kicked off the year with surfboards and skateboards hanging throughout the Runyan Gallery.

Capital-Improvement Project, New Logo, Mayors' Show

officials, City of Newport leadership, and OCCA board members and staff gathered in the Runyan Gallery during the opening for the annual "PushPin" exhibition. A ceremonial yellow ribbon was cut by Newport Mayor Sandy Roumagoux, marking the completion of the "VAC Capital-Improvement Project," which included new flooring in the Runyan Gallery, the main entry staircase carpeting and the second-floor hallway flooring, as well as the transformation of the existing second-floor darkroom and storage area into a new media room and classroom.

The Capital-Improvement Project enjoyed the support of The Ford Family Foundation, the City of Newport, the VAC Building Fund, the Yaquina Art Association, the Coastal Arts Guild, and local businesses and volunteers.

During the December 5 ribbon-cutting, a new VAC logo was unveiled. The logo was developed in collaboration with Newport designer Eric Greenwood, who was selected through the logo contest's call for proposals.

On the same evening, Mayor Roumagoux, Waldport Mayor Susan Woodruff, and OCCA VAC Director Tom Webb announced the creation of the "Mayors' Show" for the following January. (Artists from the "PushPin" show were selected for a broader exhibition of their works, as curated by the two Lincoln County mayors.)

n Sept. 25, OCCA and the VAC lost a local treasure in Nancy Jane Reid, the former OCCA VAC director and enthusiast behind youth arts learning programs at the VAC. To honor her legacy, the Nancy Jane Reid Fund was estab-

lished and a new Youth Arts Advisory Group was formed. Shortly thereafter, the Art Fridays youth arts program was launched. Over the course of the year, 20 class offerings drew 151 students.
